Growth has been led by the tourist sector, which employs about 30% of the labour force and provides more than 70% of hard currency earnings, followed by tuna fishing. In recent years the government has encouraged foreign investment to upgrade hotels and other services.

Seychelles' performance is high in the area of digital economy, with Seychelles' 70% internet penetration rate ranking third in Africa behind Kenya (90%) and Liberia (81%).
